- Interactive tours of the Center's exhibits on the history and ideas behind the founding documents, as well as key points in the evolution of policing in the United States
- In-gallery explorations of key Supreme Court decisions on the rights and responsibilities of police officers and citizens under the U.S. Constitution
- Participants receive a pocket-sized copy of the U.S. Constitution
