### **Science, Medicine & Invention**

*Benjamin Rush notebook, 1793, on loan from The Library Company of Philadelphia*  
Benjamin Rush was an attending doctor during the Yellow Fever outbreak of 1793. This notebook contains his doctor diary.

*Bleeding/Shaving bowl, on loan from the Mutter Museum*

*Iron lung, on loan from the Mutter Museum*  
This iron lung was used first in Philadelphia.

### **A Nation Unites**

The first time the flag left Fort McHenry was to fly above the State House in Philadelphia in 1876 for the Centennial Exposition. It is incredibly rare to have snippings of all three colors of the flag.

James Tanner was called upon on April 14, 1865 to record the testimony of people who witnessed the shooting of President Lincoln earlier that evening.
