On the anniversary of Victory over Japan (V-J) Day, visitors can put on their "Victory Suits" and take a trip back to the 1940s as they join in the celebration of the end of World War II with the National Constitution Center's V for Victory party! Guests can dance to tunes from the 1940s, play flag relay, learn how to make homemade marbles, and join in other fun crafts during this All-American party. Kids can also plant their own victory gardens and grow their own vegetables, just as families did during the war. Since sugar was rationed, partygoers will enjoy sugarless chocolate cake from 12:00 p.m. -1:00 p.m.

From May 25 through September 3, 2007 the National Constitution Center will host *Eyewitness: American Originals from the National Archives*. The exhibition presents first-hand accounts of watershed events in American history. Through letters, diaries, photographs, and audio and film recordings from the National Archives and its Presidential libraries, visitors to the *Eyewitness* exhibition will gain new and unique insights into well-known occurrences.

Eyewitness: American Originals from the National Archives is free with regular museum admission of \$12 for adults, \$11 for seniors ages 65 and up, and \$8 for children ages 4-12. Active military personnel and children ages 3 and under are free. Group rates are also available. An Acoustiguide audio tour is available for \$3 per person and \$2 for members.
