## TOM BROKAW REFLECTS ON THE 1960s AT THE NATIONAL CONSTITUTION CENTER

Philadelphia, PA (November 9, 2007) – The National Constitution Center welcomes **Tom Brokaw**, bestselling author and veteran broadcaster, to discuss his new book, *Boom! Personal Reflections on the Sixties and Today*, on Wednesday, November 28, 2007 at 6:30 p.m. Admission is \$12 for members, \$15 for non-members, and \$6 for K-12 students and teachers. In *Boom!*, Brokaw brings to life a pivotal time in American history, the 1960s. The veteran news anchor surveys how famous people, ordinary citizens, and the national mindset were all affected by an unforgettable time of turbulence and change, and shows how the aftershocks of the Sixties continue to resound in our lives today.

Tom Brokaw is the author of four bestsellers: *The Greatest Generation*, *The Greatest Generation Speaks*, *An Album of Memories*, and *A Long Way From Home*. Brokaw was the White House correspondent for NBC News during the Watergate scandal, and later anchored NBC's "Today" show. From 1983 through 2004, he served as anchor and managing editor of "NBC Nightly News with Tom Brokaw." He has won every major award in broadcast journalism.

**Andrea Mitchell**, Chief Foreign Affairs Correspondent for NBC News, will moderate the discussion. Mitchell reports on evolving foreign policy issues in the United States and abroad for all NBC News broadcasts, including "NBC Nightly News with Brian Williams," "Today," and on both CNBC and MSNBC.
