Frequently Asked Questions

Who is eligible for the Annenberg Summer Teacher Institute

The program is open to public, private and home-school teachers as well as other school personnel. Teachers and administrators from all levels and disciplines may apply, but preference will be given to teachers who incorporate American history themes and civics in their classrooms. Are teachers from the same school or institution allowed to apply to the Institutes?

Yes.

Are you allowed to apply to both the Annenberg Summer Teacher Institute and the NEH Landmarks of American History Program at the National Constitution Center?

Yes, but please note that applications are considered by separate selection committees, acceptance to one does not guarantee acceptance to the other.

Can I pick what session I would like to attend?

Yes, you must indicate your preference between which of the two weeks on your cover letter. We will do our best to accommodate your preference, but cannot guarantee the choice of weeks.

What is the stipend and what does it pay for?

A \$1,200 stipend is provided to help cover the cost of housing, travel, and other you may incur at the Institute. The National Constitution Center will provide the following: breakfast, lunch, and a snack each day of the Institute as well as a final farewell dinner on Thursday evening.

How will applicants be selected?

All applications will be read by a selection committee, comprised of National Constitution Center Education staff and members of the Institute's faculty. The committee will be looking for applications that demonstrate a genuine passion for the teaching of the United States Constitution and the applicability of the content presented in the Institute to your classroom.

When will I be notified whether or not I have been selected?

You will be notified of selection by April 1st.

May I bring my family or friends?

Yes, BUT we do ask that they not attend sessions designated for Institute participants. They are welcome to attend evening sessions and extra activities that may be planned.

What are my responsibilities as a participant?

The National Constitution Center expects each attendee to be an active participant in all sessions Monday through Friday. Participants will also be required to submit a lesson plan or activity developed with content gathered at the Institute. The final product should be submitted to the National Constitution Center within one month of the workshops' end.

Where will I be staying? Are rooms shared or private?

Private hotel rooms have been reserved at a local hotel. Many participants choose to share hotel rooms. Information on contacting other participants will be provided in your acceptance package.

Do I get graduate, in-service, or new teacher credit for participation?

Pennsylvania educators are eligible for Act 48 credits. Educators from other states will receive a

formal letter stating the total number of professional development hours. The National Constitution Center's education staff is happy to assist you with your state's professional development system to gain recognition of work completed. Participants may also purchase three graduate credits through Arcadia University. Registration information will be given in the acceptance package.

When is the \$1,200 stipend given out? What will the institute cover?

The stipend will be given out at the completion of the last session of the Institute for all participants who submit their acceptance paperwork by April 5, 2010. All accepted participants who submit paperwork after this date will receive the check within 4-6 weeks of the workshop's end.

Where do the Institutes take place? If I choose to drive, will parking be available?

The institute will take place at the National Constitution Center located on Independence Mall in Historic Philadelphia. For those participants who live locally and are traveling to the Center, it is recommended that you take mass transit. Daily parking is available at the National Constitution Center for a fee. What time should I arrive/depart? May I leave early?

You should plan on arriving on the Sunday prior to the start of your session. You should not book departure travel until after 5pm on the Friday of the Institute. To receive the full stipend you must stay until the completion of the Institute.

What should I wear?

Summers in Philadelphia are very warm and you are encouraged to dress accordingly, please keep in mind that both museums are air conditioned and at times can be quite cool. It is also important to note that many days of the Institute involve moving and walking to historic sites, so please wear comfortable shoes.

Will I have access to the Internet?

The National Constitution Center does have a number of public access computers for your use during the Institute, and free wireless access will be available to you throughout the building and classroom. We encourage participants to bring personal laptops.

Will I get to see Philadelphia?

During the Institute you will have the opportunity to visit a number of sites in the area. You will have time in the evening and Sunday before the Institute to explore.
